- ◆ Remain vigilant
- ◆ Educate yourself and your children
  - ◆ Be aware of behavior changes
  - ◆ Know the signs & symptoms
  - ◆ Have discussions, don't ignore it
    - ◆ Don't make assumptions
    - ◆ Don't think, “my ‘...’ knows better”
  - ◆ Have a plan for your child if they get into a situation where they need to be able to say no.
    - ◆ Prepare for what to do for an Overdose
    - ◆ Be familiar with text shortcuts
