The JROTC Program emphasizes the elements of leadership, physical fitness, drill and ceremony, Marine Corps history and traditions, military customs and courtesies, basic first aid, marksmanship, and military organization and orientation. Instruction throughout the program includes both lectures and practical application.

The program is designed with three years of structured curriculum. A fourth year will be available for those students who excel during the first three years of the program. These students will be assigned as “Assistant Instructors” under the supervision of the Marine Instructors.

The program also sponsors competition Drill and Marksmanship Teams which compete against other Junior ROTC units both locally and out of state. Both teams follow UIL rules of eligibility for team members.

The critical ingredient for a student’s success in this program is the selection of the program by the student, not the parent or counselor.

This program is based upon strict rules of discipline which must be accepted by the student in order to continue in the program.

All uniforms, training aids and equipment are provided to the students by the Marine Corps at no cost.

JROTC is not offered at JHS for 2019-20. The program must be approved. More to come on Military Science at JHS.

Naval Science I

Course Number: J101.MY

Grade Placement: 9-12

Prerequisite: None

Credit: 1

This course is an introduction into the NJROTC program. The curriculum will cover citizenship, democratic form of government and role of the military. Students will learn how to wear and take care of a uniform, gain an understanding of military customs and courtesies, be introduced to military drill and organizations, and gain an understanding of basic leadership principles. Physical Fitness is included in the curriculum. Wearing of a NJROTC uniform, which is provided, is required.

Naval Science II

Course Number: J102.MY

Grade Placement: 10-12

Prerequisite: Naval Science I and Instructor Approval

Credit: 1

PEIMS#: 03160200

This course covers Maritime History and Nautical Sciences. Studies include understanding the history of people's efforts to sue the seas to their advantage with a special emphasis on the role the U.S. Navy played in building our nation. The student will also study maritime, geography, oceanography, meteorology, and astronomy. Physical Fitness is included in the curriculum. Wearing of a NJROTC uniform, which is provided, is required.

Naval Science III

Course Number: J103.MY

Grade Placement: 11-12

Prerequisite: Naval Science II and Instructor Approval

Credit: 1

This course covers U.S. Strategy in world affairs since 1783 in relation to the use of Sea Power, Air Power, and Land Power. The national security planning process will be presented. Basic principles of Military and International law will be discussed, to include major international treaties and agreements. Additionally, the student will learn about life in the U.S. Navy, including seamanship and nautical rules of the road. Physical Fitness is included in the curriculum. Wearing of a NJROTC uniform, which is provided, is required.

Naval Science IV

Course Number: J104.MY

Grade Placement: 12

Prerequisite: Naval Science III and Instructor Approval

Credit: 1

PEIMS#: 03160400

This course will concentrate on the principles of leadership. A special emphasis will be placed on the ethics and morals involved in leadership situations. Case studies of actual situations involving leadership decisions will be used. Physical Fitness is included in the curriculum. Wearing of a NJROTC uniform, which is provided, is required.
