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District-wide High School Summary

District Strengths (Dark Green)

Compared to high school students in Texas, Hays CISD high school students are at comparatively low risk in the areas of:

- Smoking cigarettes
- Quitting smoking
- Purchasing cigarettes from a store or gas station

District Needs (Orange and Red)

Hays CISD high school students are at comparatively high risk in the areas of:

- Seat belt use
- Early initiation of sexual activity
- Not eating vegetables

Purpose, Methods and Reporting Notes

The Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance (YRBS) is a nationally accredited and validated survey developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) used to evaluate health-risk behaviors. The survey used to evaluate Hays Consolidated ISD has been modified from its original form to fit the district's request for information.

Evaluation of the high school student population in the District will contribute to the local knowledge base about current youth risk behaviors and the development of interventions/programs to address the most prevalent behaviors.

The YRBS monitors six types of health-risk behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of death and disability among youth and adults, including:

- Behaviors that contribute to unintentional injuries and violence
- Sexual behaviors that contribute to unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases
- Alcohol and other drug use
- Tobacco use
- Unhealthy dietary behaviors
- Inadequate physical activity
- [CDC YRBSS](#) also measures the prevalence of obesity and asthma among youth and young adults.

Hays CISD administered the survey via paper-based survey and Scantron in May 2014. Surveys were administered to all high school students across the District. Of those administered, 3,265 students responded.

The total population of respondents was as follows:

- Hays High School: 57.6% (1774)
- Lehman High School: 39.1% (1206)
- Impact Center: 1.6% (48)
- Live Oak Academy: 1.3% (40)

Data presented in each table are from the following sources:

- **United States 2013:** United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), national-level data from YRBS administered in 2013
- **State of Texas 2013:** United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, state-level data from YRBS administered in 2013
- **Hays CISD 2012:** Hays CISD, district-wide administration of YRBS in May 2012
- **Hays CISD 2014:** Hays CISD, district-wide administration of YRBS May, 22 2014

Percent difference between Hays CISD and Texas data (or national) was calculated by subtracting Texas data percent from Hays CISD percent, then dividing by the average of the two and multiplying by 100%. In this report, negative percent difference indicates that the Hays CISD percent is lower than the Texas percent; positive percent difference indicates that the Hays CISD percent is higher than the Texas percent.

Shading demonstrates the degree to which Hays CISD differs from the state or national data. Statements for which Hays CISD had a lower risk were shaded green; statements in which Hays CISD had a higher risk were shaded in red. The table below shows the meaning of each shade of green and red.

While the degree of difference from Texas is a guide for areas of focus, it is also important to consider whether the percent of Hays CISD students engaging in each of these behaviors is acceptable to the community.

Future administrations of the YRBS will build upon lessons learned from the 2012 and 2014 administration of the survey in order to maximize response rates from every school.

Unintentional Injuries and Violence

- Hays CISD students reported fairly high percentage of engaging in unsafe driving behaviors compared to National and Texas data.
- More students responded that they did not attend school due to feeling unsafe at school or on their way to or from school on at least 1 day during the 30 days before the survey than National and Texas Data.
- More students reported feeling sad or hopeless (almost every day for 2 or more weeks in a row) as compared to students nationally and statewide.
- Hays CISD students reported higher percentages of attempting suicide and suicide attempts resulting in injuries that needed treatment than National and Texas data.

Tobacco Use

- Hays CISD students reported ever trying cigarette smoking less often than National and Texas data.
- Hays CISD students reported usually obtaining their own cigarettes by buying them in a store or gas station substantially less often than National and Texas data.

Alcohol and Other Drug Use

- Hays CISD students’ reported higher levels of alcohol use than U.S. and Texas report. However, substantially fewer reported usually obtaining the alcohol they drank by someone giving it to them.
- The percent of Hays CISD students who report ever having smoke marijuana, tried the drug prior to the age of 13, and smoked it within the past month are higher than respondents at the national and state level.
- Students at Hays CISD reported a higher percentage of ever taking prescription drugs without a doctor’s prescription more than national and statewide reports.
- 32.4% of Hays CISD students reported being offered, sold, or given an illegal drug by someone on school property within the past year before the survey. This percentage is substantially higher than U.S., Texas, and prior Hays reports.

Sexual Behavior

- Hays CISD students reported ever having sexual intercourse less often than U.S, Texas, and previous Hays reports.
- Hays CISD students were more likely to report being taught in school about AIDS or HIV infection than students statewide.
- One out of every 8 Hays CISD students reported having had four or more sexual partner during their lives.

Dietary Behaviors and Weight Control

- More students reported not eating fruit during the week prior to this survey than students nation and statewide.
- More Hays CISD students reported not that they had not eaten for 24 hours or more, had vomited or took laxatives, or had taken diet pills, powders or liquids (without doctor’s advice) to lose weight or to keep from gaining weight in the month prior to this survey than national and statewide reports.

Physical Activity

- Approximately half of Hays CISD students report not attending physical education classes in an average week when in school. However, this percentage is lower than U.S. and Texas reports.
- More Hays CISD students (one out of every two) reported not playing on a sports team run by the school or community groups during the year prior to this survey than national and statewide reports.
- Hays CISD students reported watching television less often per day compared to U.S., Texas, and prior Hays reports.
- Additionally, Hays CISD students used computers less often per day compared to the other data sources as well.
